A Message from the President

I would like to share, what I consider to be two amazing historical accomplishments that the Solana Beach Civic and Historical Society has recently completed.

The first is the combined efforts of three remarkable research historians, Jim Nelson, Richard Schwartzlose and Richard Moore. We are sad to say that two of these historians have recently passed away. However, thanks to these three historians and their supportive wives we have a wonderful historical legacy to pass on and share with the community.

We are happy to announce the completion of a sourcebook begun a number of years ago by Jim Nelson at the request of the San Dieguito River Valley Park Rangers. This book is "The Early History Of The Western End Of the San Dieguito River Valley". The book is a lecture series and pictorial history that covers the time span from 11,000 years ago up through California Statehood. I hope you all take the opportunity to check this book out from our Historical Museum. It's amazing. Did you know that Mastodons, Mammoths, Saber Tooth Tigers and Camelops roamed our river valley? The book also covers the Indians who lived here and the Spanish conquest. Check it out!

We are happy that our society supported this project with funding and encouragement and we are making it available to local school districts as well as other local organizations for use as a reference book and as an aid in educational lectures. In the binder format that schools will be using we have attached a flash drive with the lecture images for use with a projector.

Jim outlined a second sourcebook phase continuing to the present day which would include the development of the San Dieguito River Valley and would have covered the evolution of Del Mar and Solana Beach. Hopefully this story can be continued in the future!

The second historical project that we have recently completed is the addition of QR Codes to all of our Historical Buildings in Solana Beach. If you download a QR App you can access all the historical info on these buildings.



Editorial


On March 22, the Solana Beach Civic and Historical Society made a generous donation to the Solana Beach Skate Park that will be located at the park in Eden Gardens. Surprisingly a few members have reservations about a skatepark in Solana Beach. I want to reassure you of the benefits so many communities have discovered in having a skatepark. There are social benefits of providing a facility for young people to pursue an athletic activity that they love. There are public health benefits in having a safe place for young people to develop active lifestyles away from the risks found in the streets.

Skateparks, if designed and constructed correctly, are fiscally conservative and require very little maintenance. There are 30 year-old well-designed skateparks which continue to provide a fun, safe spot for skateboarding.

I serve on the Executive Board of the Tony Hawk Foundation. We have donated over \$5.5 million to help create public skateparks. We have donated funding to 572 skateparks in the United States (including to the Solana Beach skatepark) and in 2015 alone, provided worldwide assistance and training to 400 skatepark projects. I have been privileged to attend the opening of many skateparks and see the joy in the faces of skaters, parents and community leaders as their dreams become reality.


