

Enjoy a Musical Evening on February 13

Please allow me to give a "shoutout" to our Board and to the members and friends who give us feedback on programs we've presented -- and ideas for new ones. The Board meets for lunch every summer to think "outside the box" about what programs we can bring to our Society members -- a favorite has always been the youth musical evenings.

This year, there was difficulty finding a musical program. Local high schools were contacted, other avenues tried ... crickets.

Solosoli music instructor Sang Shen, violinist, was born to musician parents in Shanghai, China. She was accepted to the prestigious Shanghai



Conservatory of Music at age 9 and went on to win most major competitions in China. She also performed as a soloist with the Shanghai Symphony Orchestra.

In 1988, Ms. Shen moved to Chicago to study violin at Roosevelt University on a full scholarship.

In 1989, she won the the Leonard Sorkin Award for Violin and the Harvey Mittenthal Scholarship. In 1990 and 1991 she won second prize in the American Opera Society Competitions and became Concertmaster of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra's Civic Orchestra under the direction of conductors such as Sir George Solti and Pierre Bolez.

Since moving to San Diego 10 years ago, Ms. Shen has developed a successful teaching career. Many of her students have won concertmaster positions, competitions and scholarships. In addition to teaching, she plays with the San Diego Symphony, the Classics 4 Kids concert series and the California Chamber Orchestra. I asked one of my theater students, Mika Casavan, who attends Canyon Crest Academy and is a part of their orchestra program, if he knew of a group; he led us to the Solosoli Music Studio and Sang Shen.

I am so thrilled that four of the studio's young students will showcase their talents at our next meeting on Thursday, February 13th at La Colonia Community Center, 715 Valley Ave. What a treat! Please read about the students on the following page and join us for an evening of Vivaldi's "Four Seasons."

Meanwhile our Society is gearing up for a busy spring season! Want to help?

Zen Parris is a dedicated musician with a passion for violin. His musical journey began at the age of 5 and he has already made big strides in his musical education and performing experience. As an 8th grader, he currently plays with the Mainly Mozart Youth Orchestra (MMYO), where he has earned 3rd place two years in a row in their annual solo competition, both in Intermediate and Advanced orchestra. He has been accepted into the California All-State and All-Southern Orchestras, and was concertmaster for the SDUSD Middle School Honor Orchestra. Zen also recently accompanied a rock band of fellow 13 year olds for several gigs, including at the Del Mar Fair and the Point Loma Summer Concerts. He enjoys joining fellow classical musicians at fundraising events for the Helen Woodward Animal Shelter.

Brian Chen is an 11-year-old 5th grader at Solana Santa Fe. His musical journey began in 2019

with Ms. Sang Shen. As a member of the MMYO since 2020, Brian currently plays in the intermediate orchestra. In 2024, he joined the Quartet Strings for Wings fundraising for childhood cancer and, in September, became a violinist in a piano quintet, exploring chamber music with his MMYO friends. Brian's favorite composers are Antonio Vivaldi and Niccolò Paganini. Outside of music, he enjoys swimming, reading, traveling, and his favorite subject in school is math.



Julia Yu is a 9-year-old 4th grader in Solana Pacific Elementary School. She started her musical journey at age 5. She plays violin in Mainly Mozart Youth Orchestra and won 3rd place in the solo competition in Intermediate

Strings group. She participated in string quartets with both Solosoli and Boston Youth Symphony. She enjoys playing duets with her sister, Rachel. Besides violin, Julia is also an achieved piano player and recently debuted in Carnegie Hall. Julia shares her love for music through frequent performances with other young musicians in nursing homes around San Diego.

Rachel Yu is an 11-year-old 6th grader in Solana Pacific Elementary School. She started learning the violin at age of 7. She also performs with the MMYO and won honorable mention in the solo competition in Intermediate Strings group. She played string quartets in the summers with Solosoli and Boston Youth Symphony. Civic Updates . . .

Mayor Heebner Elected to Chair SANDAG Board

Congratulations to Solana Beach Mayor Lesa Heebner, who has been unanimously elected as the new Chair of the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) Board of Directors. With over 20 years of service to Solana Beach and 14 years of experience on the SANDAG Board, including two years as Second Vice Chair, Mayor Heebner is ready to lead the region's efforts to plan, build, and provide critical infrastructure that benefits all of San Diego County. Pending projects include controversial plans to relocate the LOSSAN (Los Angeles to San Diego) rail corridor away from the crumbling bluffs of Del Mar. As Chair, Mayor Heebner succeeds former San Diego County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman Nora Vargas. She will work alongside newly elected Vice Chair Joe LaCava, President of the San Diego City Council, and Second Vice Chair John Minto, Mayor of Santee.

Irrigation District's Proposed Fee Increases Discussed Feb. 12



The Santa Fe Irrigation District's (SFID) proposed new water rates were outlined in the Proposition 218 Notice sent to customers in late December. Rates are increasing due to Lake Hodges Dam repairs. The cost of one acrefeet of water to the SFID previously (when Lake Hodges was fully operational) was \$300. Lake Hodges used to provide about 30% of our water at that cost. Currently, SFID's cost for the same amount water is \$2,000 because the San Diego Water Authority is the supplier. The new rates will be reviewed at a public hearing during the SFID Board meeting on February 12th at 8:30 a.m. at the district offices, 5920 Linea Del Cielo, Rancho Santa

Fe, CA 92067. The proposed rates were presented to Solana Beach City Council at a January meeting. <u>Click</u> <u>here to watch this important presentation</u>.

In July, 2024, SFID and the San Dieguito Water District filed a lawsuit against the City of San Diego, citing breach of contract, loss of local water, and other claims. The lawsuit seeks financial damages due to lack of the District's access to local water supply from Lake Hodges. The complaint alleges lack of proper maintenance of Hodges Dam resulted in an unsatisfactory rating by the State of California Department of Safety of Dams and a mandated restricted lower lake level. As a result of the City's negligence, most water captured in Lake Hodges must be released, limiting the amount of water available to both districts, which violates long-standing agreements between the City and the agencies.
