Join us for an Update on our City's Many Initiatives

City Manager Alyssa Muto will provide updates on the City's many recent projects and ongoing initiatives, including:

- Fletcher Cove improvements, including plans for a new Marine Safety Center
- La Colonia Park improvements, including the possibility of a second community center there
- Planning for the Lomas Santa Fe corridor
- Planning for a park at Larrick Reservoir
- Planning for a Santa Helena Neighborhood Trail
- The new Beach Cleanup Station at Fletcher Cove, established in April
- New tree plantings along South Sierra Ave., South Acacia and in the Distillery Parking lot, which follow
 installation of a new sidewalk and tree grates. Both projects are aimed at improving accessibility and
 walkability. The City also planted a large Torrey Pine along the Coastal

Rail Trail near Via De La Valle, replacing a mature tree that fell during recent high winds

Ms. Muto joined the City staff last year, after serving as Director of the Sustainability & Mobility Department for the City of San Diego. If you haven't had an opportunity to meet her, please join our meeting and introduce yourself!

CarFit® is a FREE, interactive and educational program designed to improve older driver safety. Your 15-minute in person appointment with a certified CarFit® technician who will provide information ensuring the safest "fit" for drivers and their vehicles.

To help older drivers remain mobile, Scripps Health Trauma Injury Prevention Team and Solana Beach Presbyterian Church will host a CarFit® event. Designed to help seniors over 55 years of age, CarFit® helps older drivers learn how the effects of aging can change the way they fit in their vehicle and how their driving can be affected.

CarFit®'s 12-point checklist on the driver and the car includes evaluating:

- Seat-belt adjustment
- Car pedals
- Seat and steering wheel positioning
- Visibility through windows and mirrors

Often after adjusting these vehicle components drivers report feeling safer and more comfortable. Also, participants will learn how to better maintain and strengthen their driving skills.

All drivers who attend will receive a free resource bag filled with informative goodies and places to go for further evaluation.
